TWO-DAY BUDDHIST CHANTING CEREMONY AND WORLD PEACE WALK TO BE HELD IN BERKELEY, CA September 18-19th 2015

(Berkeley, CA) – Following the success of the event in 2014, the Berkeley-based Light of Buddhadharma Foundation International, in association with its sister organizations of Dharma College, the Nyingma Institute and the Mangalam Centers will host the Second International Tipitaka Chanting Ceremony at the temples of Mangalam Centers, 2018 Allston Way, and Dharma College, 2222 Harold Way, in downtown Berkeley on Friday and Saturday September 18-19th 2015. The Tipitaka (three baskets) contains the teachings of the Buddha given during his lifetime and preserved in the language of Pali.

The event will begin with a Peace Walk procession at 8:00 am from the Nyingma Institute, 1815 Highland Place, through the campus of University of California, Berkeley to the Mangalam Centers building. Over 50 eminent Theravadin monks and nuns from Northern California's Burmese, Cambodian, Laotian, Thai, Sri Lankan and Vietnamese Buddhist temples will attend the two-day event, along with many lay Buddhist practitioners from around the Bay Area. The general public are warmly invited to attend. A Dharma talk will be offered in English on the evening of September 18th by the Venerable Dr. Walpola Piyananda and a cultural show will complete the event on the evening of September 19th.

"We are so happy to be able to host the second chanting ceremony following our great success in 2014. Many participants were deeply moved by the event, as attending a chanting ceremony is a wonderful experience. May the blessings enter our spirit and bring benefit to all! DHARMA SPEAKER

Ven. Dr. Piyananda was born in 1943, in Sri Lanka. He received his first ordination in 1955 and full ordination as a bhikkhu in 1970. After graduating with Honors with a BA in Buddhist Studies from Kaleniya University he continued his studies abroad in India (M.A. Calcutta University) with a Commonwealth Scholarship. In the United States Ven. Piyananda received an additional M.A. from Northwestern University in Evanston in 1980, and in 1985 he completed the requirements for a Ph.D. at U.C.L.A. He also received a Ph.D. from the College of Buddhist Studies in Los Angeles in 1997. He received the title of Tripitaka Dharma [should this say 'Tipitaka Dharma'?] Visarada Rohana Kirthi Sri from the University of Ruhuna, Sri Lanka in 2003. In 2013 the government of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar awarded him the title of Agga Maha Pandita.

Since Ven. Dr. Piyananda arrived in the United States he has developed a continuous program of meditation classes and Dhamma discussions both locally and abroad. He lectures at various colleges and universities throughout the United States. He has a deep understanding of human nature and always propagates Dhamma for world peace. He has visited many countries promoting world peace.
